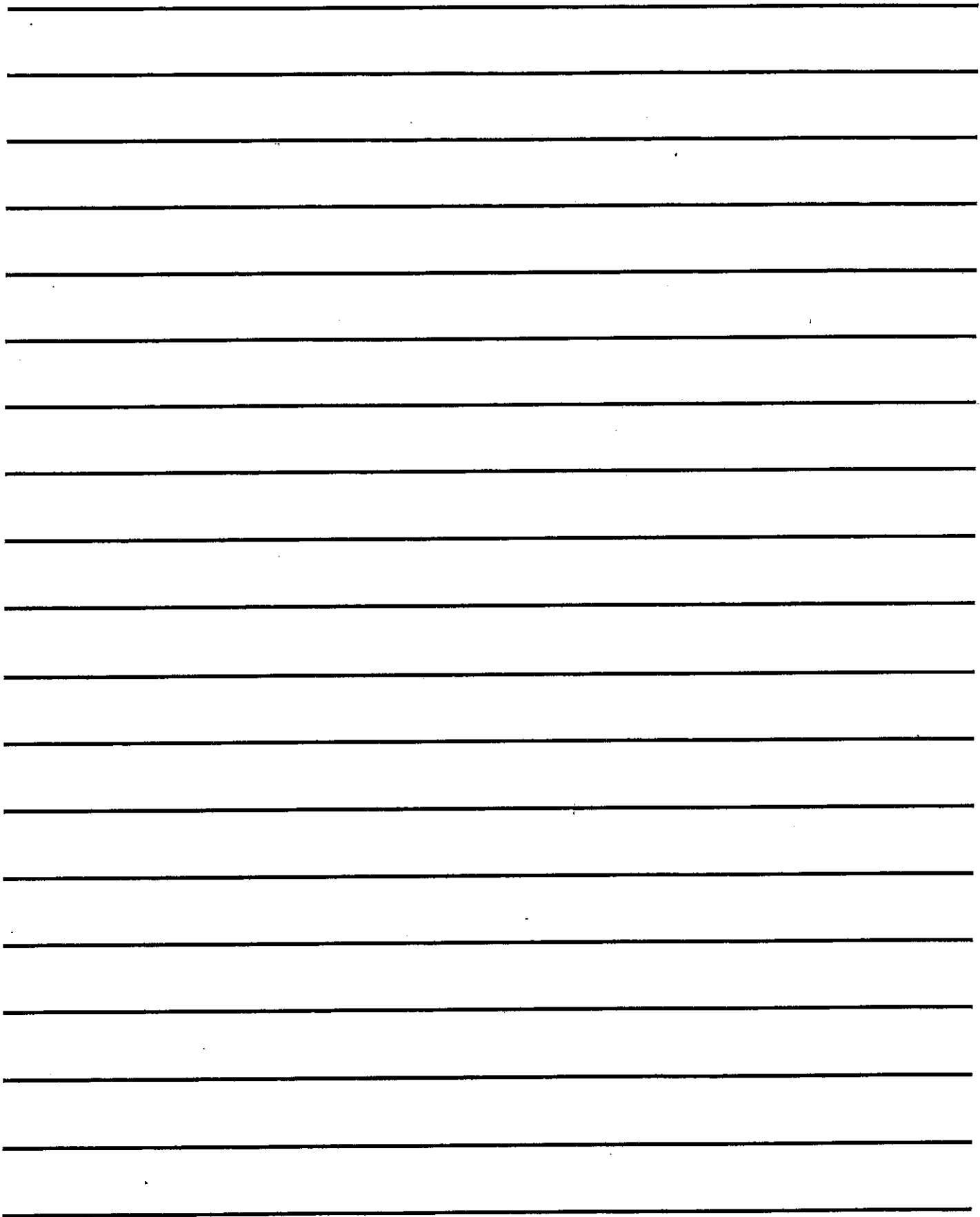


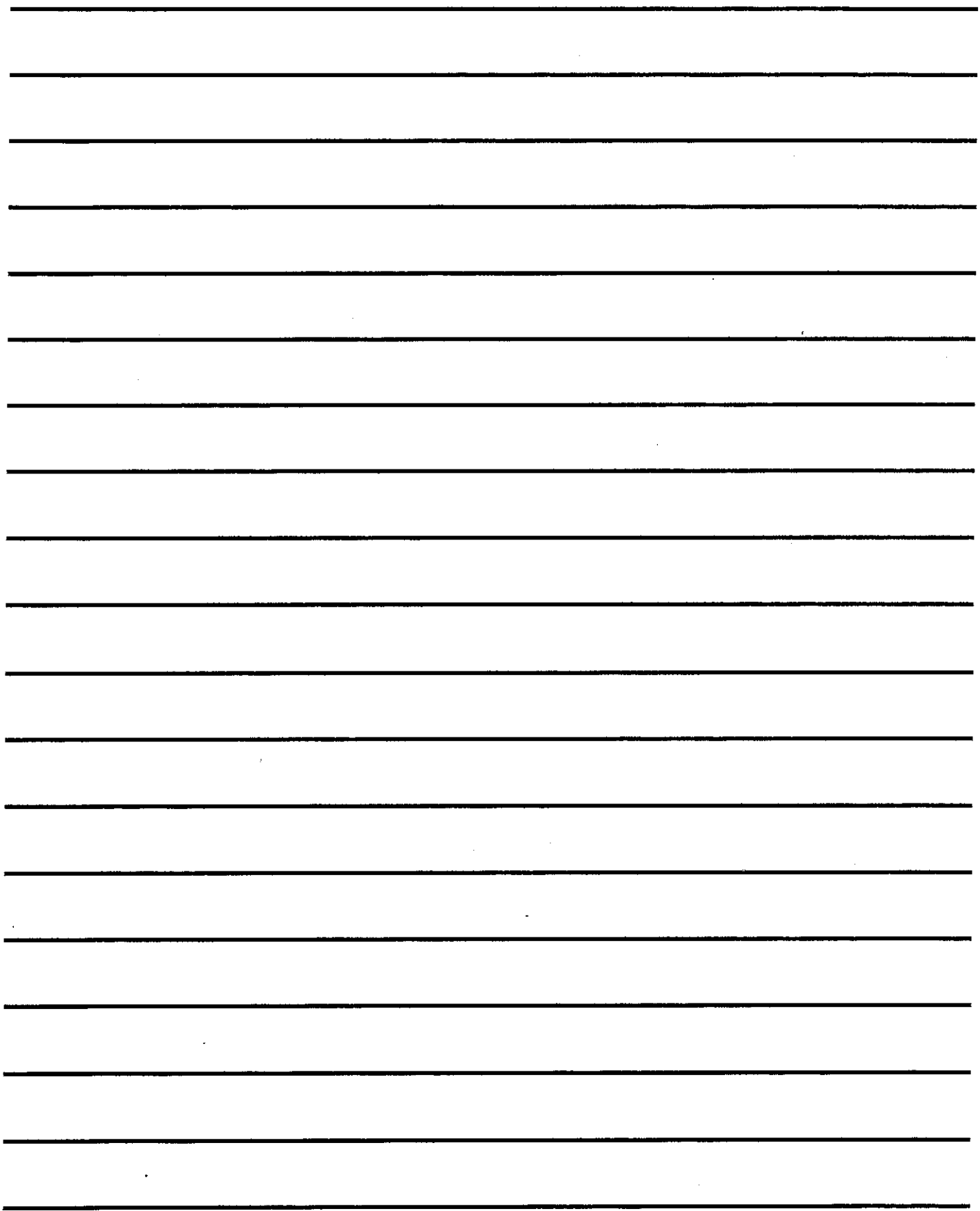
Choose 2 prompts that you would like to do. You may use the following lined paper to complete them. You may add paper if needed.







Math Brain Teaser Homework

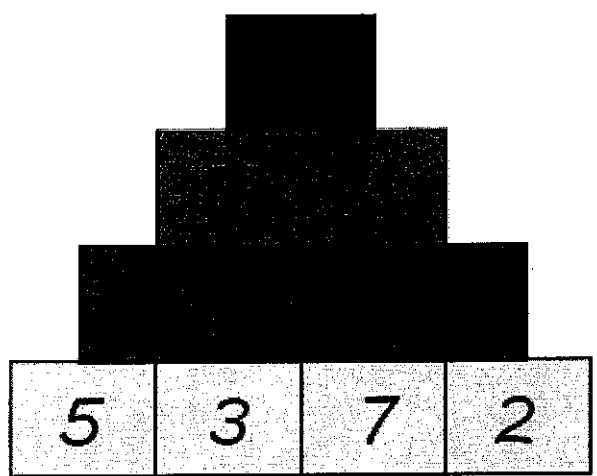
